
Wroxham FC



Wroxham Women started life as Acle United Ladies in the NWGFL Second Division and in the 2009-2010 season gained promotion to the First Division after finishing runners-up. Their first year in the top division saw the Ladies lift the League Cup after beating Aylsham 2-1, as well as finish third in the league. The 2011-12 season was the most successful in the Ladies short history after clinching the League and Cup double. Hethersett Ladies Heart were beaten 5-4 in the cup final, whilst the league title success enabled promotion to the Eastern Region Women's Football League Division One North. A new league brought new challenges for Acle with a lot more travelling to matches, however in their first season the Ladies managed to avoid relegation but also reached the final of the Norfolk Women's Cup for the first time, losing to Norwich City Ladies at The FDC.

The next three seasons saw the team narrowly missing out on promotion to the FAWNL, twice finishing runners up although they did capture the League cup beating AFC Dunstable 6-r and were beaten finalists in the County Cup losing narrowly 3-2 to Wymondham Town. Ground grading requirements forced the team to move to Wroxham who were looking to add a women's team and their final game as Acle was fittingly played at Wroxham to introduce the side to their new environment. However, the first two seasons were curtailed by Covid and the side played only 40% of their games during that period. Last season the team finished a respectable 4th in the league.

With the previous manager Bex moving on to newer pastures, Joe Simpson, the new gaffer has rebuilt the side with half the side playing open age football for the first time, after the old squad saw a number of players retire or move on to other clubs and this season is being used to develop the younger players A new season and a new manager in Adam Race and his coaching staff in charge for the 2023-24 season with majority of the players retained and some new faces. It was a good debut season for the new manager with a 5th place finish in the league and beaten finalists in the Norfolk Women's Cup and ERWFL League Cup.

Joe Simpson took over towards the end of last season after the previous management stood down and has carried on for the 2025-26 season.

By providing financial resources to the club, Ginny and I have enabled the club to offer a safe, stable, and supportive environment for our players and coaches.

Larry Gies, whose \$150 million gift to the University of Illinois business school secured naming rights, also made a gift of \$100 million to the University's athletic programs. In exchange, the former Memorial Stadium for gridiron football is now known as Gies Memorial Stadium. I rather cheekily congratulated Larry for being the second person associated with the school to have secured naming rights to a stadium, but I truly value and respect his support for Illinois athletics.
